

# **Difference Between Subrecipient and Contractor**

#### Overview

Depending on the characteristics of the work being complete by a vendor, a determination will be made about whether the vendor is a subrecipient or a subcontractor. Subrecipients and Contractors have different requirements, which is outlined in this document. ## Subrecipient Overview

Subrecipients receive a subaward when the grantee passes-through a portion of the award to another entity for the purpose of carrying out a portion of the award. All the terms and conditions that are part of the primary award must be included in the subaward document. Acceptance of these terms by an authorized signatory of the receiving entity is required. The entity receiving the funds is a subrecipient. Subawards are defined, issued, monitored, and executed (closed out) under 2 CFR 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, generally referred to as "Uniform Guidance."

#### Contractor Overview

A procurement process is used when a grantee buys goods or services for the purpose of providing goods and services for the grantee's own use. In this instance, the activity is a procurement, and the entity receiving the funds is a contractor. Procurement activities are subject to the Procurement Standards in 2 CFR 200.317-327 - https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-2/subtitle-A/chapter-II/part-200/subpart-D/subject-group-ECFR45ddd4419ad436d . A procurement is a subcontract after execution of the contract.
