Recap of BEAD and progress to date



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BEAD is a \$42B federal grant program that aims to bring high-speed internet to all Americans

\$42.45 billion

Funds provided for BEAD

The Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program is a federal grant program that aims to get all Americans online by funding partnerships between states or territories, communities, and stakeholders to build infrastructure where high-speed internet is currently unavailable

Program highlights

Eligible entities

- All 50 States, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico
- Other Territories: U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands

Example eligible uses of funds

- Planning for the deployment of high-speed Internet, including conducting research, collecting data, outreach, and training
- Deploying or upgrading Internet in un/underserved areas
- Improving service to community anchor institutions
- Installing Internet and Wi-Fi in multi-unit residential buildings
- Workforce development, including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations to support deployment, maintenance, and upgrades



What are the goals of BEAD?



Ensure universal coverage across all un/underserved locations in the state, maximizing deployment of end-to-end fiber, and only using non-fiber where fiber costs are extremely high¹



Run subgrantee selection process within one year of approval of the Initial Proposal, and complete implementation within four years of receipt of funds³



Prioritize projects providing broadband access to unserved and underserved locations and community anchor institutions, Wi-Fi equipment for Multi-Dwelling Units (MDUs) then other digital equity and inclusion priorities²



The BEAD Program awarded Illinois \$1.04 billion to connect all unserved and underserved locations to broadband over the next 5 years







Map Layers

Click on the check box to toggle on or off layers to view different elements of the map.



PAU Aggregate Areas = The hexagonal area surrounding locations that belong to the same PAU

Eligible Location = Points on the map which belong to PAUs and are eligible to be connected through the BEAD Program

Ineligible Locations = Locations that are not eligible for the BEAD Program (i.e., classified as served)


High-Cost Areas = Census Block Groups that NTIA considers above average cost to serve. Project areas consisting of only Project Area Units in High-Cost Areas are exempt from the minimum 25 percent matching funds requirements


Search for a location (address, zip code, county, town) in the search bar to zoom to that area

Each point is a location. Locations in the same Project Area Unit (PAU) share a color. PAUs with a red outline are Hard-to-Serve.

On the PAUs tab, view a list of PAUs on the lefthand panel as you explore the map




Click on a location or a hexagon where a location falls to view information about a PAU.

Click "Add to My PAUs" to add it to your project.



Shared Hexagons

If locations from different PAUs fall within the same hexagon, there is an option to toggle between the PAUs to ensure you're selecting the intended PAU




Bulk PAU Selection

Use the lasso tool to select more than one PAU or to lasso a group of PAUs

Click a PAU again to remove it

Click "Add to My PAUs" to add them to a project area






Bulk PAU Selection

If locations from different PAUs fall within the same hexagon, there is an option to toggle between the PAUs to ensure you're selecting the intended PAU

Look for the note: "Selection includes [#] shared hexagons"

Then, use the CNTRL key to select more than one (or all) PAUs based on the PAU ID




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My PAUs

A conflict of interest exists if an organization's officers, directors, agents, employees and/or their spouses or immediate family members use their position(s) for a purpose that is, or gives the appearance of, being motivated by a desire for a personal gain, financial or nonfinancial, whether direct or indirect, for themselves or others, particularly those with whom they have a family business or other close associations. In addition, the following conflict of interest standards apply to governmental and non-governmental entities.

Definitions:

Governmental Entity.
