What is the BEAD Program?

The BEAD Program provides \$42.45 billion to expand high-speed internet access across the US over a five-year period. Illinois has been allocated \$1.04 billion in funding to ensure high-speed internet access is available to the ~175,000 households, small businesses, and community anchor institutions (CAIs) that cannot receive internet service at speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps today

What do applications require and how can applicants apply?

Successful applications will generally meet or exceed certain key criteria (non-exhaustive):

- **Applicant match** of at least 25% and **grant** request at or below State reference cost
- Affordable 1Gbps/1Gbps or 100/20Mbps **service** (depending on project type)
- History of fair labor practices and plans for compliance with federal labor laws

- **December 23, 3034** Project Area Units published
- **January 23, 2025** Wave 1 application opens
- **February 26, 2025** Wave 1 application closes
- Spring 2025 Wave 2 application opens

Submit all **Wave 1 applications from Jan. 23 – Feb. 26**, with Wave 2 set to open in Spring 2025 Wave 1 applications must be end-to-end fiber and include at least 10% hard-to-serve PAUs. To apply, visit the Sub-Grantee Selection Process webpage, which includes other helpful resources
