Recap of BEAD and progress to date



BEAD is a \$42B federal grant program that aims to bring high-speed internet to all Americans

Note: NTIA has communicated that changes to the program are coming following a rigorous review by the U.S. Dept. of Commerce

Funds provided for BEAD

The Broadband Equity, Access, and
Deployment (BEAD) Program is a federal
grant program that aims to get all Americans
online by funding partnerships between states
or territories, communities, and stakeholders to
build infrastructure where high-speed internet is
currently unavailable

Program highlights

Eligible entities

- All 50 States, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico
- Other Territories: U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands

Example eligible uses of funds

- Planning for the deployment of high-speed Internet, including conducting research, collecting data, outreach, and training
- Deploying or upgrading Internet in un/underserved areas
- Improving service to community anchor institutions
- Installing Internet and Wi-Fi in multi-unit residential buildings
- Workforce development, including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations to support deployment, maintenance, and upgrades



What are the goals of BEAD?



The BEAD Program awarded Illinois \$1.04 billion to connect all unserved and underserved locations to broadband over the next 5 years



Ensure universal coverage across all un/underserved locations in the state, maximizing deployment of end-to-end fiber, and only using non-fiber where fiber costs are extremely high¹



Prioritize projects providing broadband access to unserved and underserved locations and community anchor institutions, Wi-Fi equipment for Multi-Dwelling Units (MDUs) then other digital equity and inclusion priorities²



Run subgrantee selection process within one year of approval of the Initial Proposal, and complete implementation within four years of receipt of funds³



Focus on improving broadband affordability through a low-cost broadband service option, and a middle-class affordability plan⁴


Overview of the BEAD-Funded Connect Illinois Round 4 timeline



Key Updates

- Wave 1 completed, with **submission** of 238 applications by 26 entities followed by '**deconfliction**', i.e., the process by which projects with overlapping PAUs are reviewed and adjusted to determine which applicant shall be awarded the overlapping PAUs
- Applicants informed of status of all Wave 1 proposals
- Wave 2 application open as of May 27, inviting applications for reliable broadband technologies



The subgrantee selection process consists of up to three waves – the first Wave is complete, and the second Wave opened on May 27



Jan 23 – Feb 26

Focus: Hard-to-serve areas

- Focused on end-to-end fiber projects
- Only applications including at least 10% hard-to serve areas were processed
- Where there were conflicting applications, the higher scoring application prevailed

Focus: All remaining locations

 All Reliable Broadband Service projects accepted and scored

May 27 – July 16

 The State will determine the cost threshold (EHCPLT), above which the State has the option to select non-fiber over fiber projects **Optional Wave 3**

Timeline to be determined

Focus: All remaining locations

- For remaining areas, applicants will have a final opportunity to submit a proposal
- The State will negotiate coverage for remaining unbid locations, and may consider Alternative Technology

What are PAUs?

Project Area Units (PAUs) are clusters of eligible locations no more than five miles apart

PAUs function
as the "building blocks"
of applications –
applicants can apply
to serve one or more
PAUs, and PAUs cannot
be separated



Before we discuss further, let's define a few concepts and terms

Project Area Unit (PAU)

A collection of un/underserved Broadband Serviceable Locations (BSLs) and Community Anchor Institutions (CAls) eligible for an application



If awarded a PAU, a subgrantee must deploy to all included eligible locations

Broadband Serviceable Location (BSL)


A business or residential location at which fixed broadband access is, or can be, installed, where:

- Unserved: Has access to broadband service with speeds of <25/3Mbps
- Underserved: ≥25/3 and <100/20Mbps
- **Served**: ≥100/20Mbps

Community Anchor Institution (CAI)


An entity that facilitates wider use of broadband service by vulnerable populations (e.g., schools, libraries, senior centers)¹

CAIs without access to 1Gbps symmetrical broadband service are eligible for BEAD funding Illustration of a PAU, where each point shown is an eligible location








Adding a PAU from the map:

If locations from different PAUs fall within the same hexagon, there is an option to toggle between the PAUs to ensure you're selecting the intended PAU

Use the **lasso tool ()**) to select more than one PAU or to lasso a group of PAUs – selected PAUs will be marked in yellow

Click a selected PAU again to remove it


