




Context

State Digital Equity Plan has been approved!

Approval of the SDEP unlocks the opportunity for Illinois to apply for first Capacity Grant allocation from NTIA of \$23.7 million to implement the plan.



Illinois State Digital Equity Plan



COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE

Foster partnerships and collaboration between new and existing organizations so that they may share their knowledge and resources to expand their impact.



DIGITAL EQUITY GRANT PROGRAM Facilitate a statewide digital equity grant program to fund and provide resources for digital equity programs around the state.



STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT Conduct and support stakeholder engagement across regions and in communities to ensure that the voices of residents and digital equity practitioners continue to be heard and to shape digital equity priorities and approaches.



STATEWIDE AND UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIPS NOFO estimated September 2024

Coordinate programming on highpriority statewide and regional projects and establish research partnerships with universities and other state agencies.



DIGITAL EQUITY SOURCE OF TRUTH Maintain and make available Illinois's digital equity data sets to serve as a common source of information.





Illinois Digital Equity Capacity Grant Tentative Grant Project Types

Device Distribution Programs

Laptop, computer, or other device distribution to Covered Populations.

Digital Literacy + Skills Training

Classes, workshops, coaching, or other learning opportunities to help Covered Populations build digital skills and confidence.

Digital Navigation + Tech Support

Individuals embedded in community trained to help connect Covered Populations access affordable broadband, digital skill building, and other essential resources.

Broadband Affordability Program

Small infrastructure projects to increase affordability and choice within multi-dwelling units (MDUs), affordable housing, or other residential communities.

Access Expansion Feasibility
Study

Opportunity for communities to chart their own broadband path through local coordination and planning.

Coalition Building

Seed funding for regional or local digital equity coalition formation, building, and growth.





NTIA Requires Prioritization of Covered Populations

Low-income households

Incarcerated individuals

People with disabilities

Racial and ethnic minorities

Aging populations

Veterans

Rural inhabitants

People with language barriers

72% of Illinoisans are part of these identity groups and communities disproportionally impacted by digital inequity

Digital Equity: The Goal


Condition where all individuals have the technology capacity needed to participate in:


- Society

- Inaccessible trainings




The Solution



Solution: Digital Navigators

Digital Navigators consistently provide holistic, individualized support through repeated interactions.









Shaping Our Appalachian Region (SOAR)

The SOAR digital navigator program provides one-on-one support for devices, digital skills and support securing hotspots for residents in the eastern Kentucky region.

- Six Counties
- Travel Costs Built Into Program Design
- Three-Year Pilot

Digital Inclusion Ecosystem


A digital inclusion ecosystem is a combination of programs and policies that meet a geographic community's unique and diverse needs. Coordinating entities work together in an ecosystem to address all aspects of the digital divide, including affordable broadband, devices, and skills.





Digital Inclusion Coalitions

- Are a collective of organizations
- To raise funding for digital inclusion programs
- To raise awareness about digital inequities and the impact on your communities



Role of Coalitions

THE ADVOCACY EFFECT

Coalitions raise the profile of digital inclusion for their communities' media, opinion leaders, and the general public.

THE ALIGNMENT EFFECT


Coalitions create a framework to align the perspectives of community players that share a concern about digital inclusion.

THE NETWORK EFFECT

Coalitions set the stage for member organizations to better understand each others' perspectives and discover opportunities.





Best Practices: Y-Zone



Establish a digital equity ecosystem driven by a coalition of committed local stakeholders, including residents and program youth

Help eligible residents receive free or low-cost digital resources through these partnerships

Collaborate with the community to identify adoption barriers and needs
