


Digital Equity and Inclusion

Digital Equity: The condition in which individuals and communities have the information technology capacity that is needed for full participation in the society and economy of the United States.

Digital Inclusion: The activities that are necessary to ensure that all individuals have access to and the use of, affordable information and communication technologies such as:

- Reliable broadband
- Devices
- Digital skills training
- Tech support
- Privacy and cybersecurity


State Digital Equity Plan Vision

- Ensuring universal access to high-speed broadband that is affordable, reliable, and fully scalable for residences, businesses, and community anchor institutions (CAIs) across Illinois by 2030.
- Leveraging new and existing resources to advance the adoption of internet use through targeted digital-inclusion strategies and sustainable broadband-equity outcomes to help communities identify and address current gaps in broadband equity.
- Empowering all Illinoisans to use and participate fully in an increasingly digital economy and society.



Illinois State Digital Equity Plan

The 2021 Digital Equity Act provides over \$30 million to Illinois to implement the State Digital Equity Plan (SDEP). The goals of the plan are to ensure that all people and communities have the skills, technology, and capacity needed to reap the full benefits of our digital economy. Core Activities of the SDEP includes:






Program Description

<u>Program Goal</u>: **Empower and equip** individuals and communities with the skills, resources, and confidence they need to use the internet to fully participate in Illinois' modern society and economy.

Further areas of focus:

- Address systemic barriers to digital equity
- Improve outcomes in health, education, economic stability, and quality of life
 - i.e., through building a resume and applying for a job, accessing healthcare from home, paying bills online, or helping family members with homework

Eligible Project Types

Digital Literacy and Skill Building

Classes, workshops, coaching, or other learning opportunities to help Covered Populations build digital skills.

Device Distribution

Distribution of devices, including laptops, computers, tablets, or other devices that address barriers faced by Covered Populations.

Digital Navigator(s)

Member of a community trained and designated to help Covered Populations enroll in high-speed internet service, navigate technology challenges, obtain devices, and find digital skill building opportunities.

Computer Center

Establish, improve, or expand community spaces with no-cost access to computers and the internet.

Local Broadband Planning

Resources for communities to create their own roadmaps to expanding broadband connectivity. This includes defining their access goals, assessing market and consumer dynamics, engaging internet providers, and exploring public-private partnerships and funding options.

One application may cover one or more project type. Please refer to NOFO for details on each project type.

Funded Initiatives Must...

Focus on Covered Populations: The project should align with the Digital Equity Plan's goals and objectives, and the priorities of the Covered Populations being served, including subgroups within each Covered Population.

Create Long-Lasting and Meaningful Change: Projects should address the systemic barriers and gaps to digital access, with a consideration for sustainability of initiatives created or expanded through this funding.

Have a Measurable Implementation Strategy: Projects should be based on objectives that are measurable, achievable, sustainable, timebound, and designed to address identified disparities directly and logically.

Involve Opportunity for Stakeholder Feedback: Stakeholders directly affected by the proposed strategies and interventions should have opportunities to provide ongoing feedback regarding the effectiveness of interventions and offers ideas on on-going improvements.

Performance Goals and Measures

Collection of data points will enable Illinois to assess the effectiveness of funded programs, per NTIA requirements.

- Grant recipients are required to incorporate program
 measurement and evaluation activities as a part of their
 program design and implementation.
- These activities must include progress made toward meeting the measurable objectives* identified in Illinois' State Digital Equity Plan.
- Additional project-specific data points to evaluate progress and impact will be identified prior to sub-grantee agreement.

Performance Goals and Measures

All projects must collect and report on the following data points, which will be further defined through sub-grantee agreements:

- a. Number of Covered Population(s) served;
- b. Number of people served within each Covered Population;
- c. Total number of people served;
- d. Number of programs implemented by type;
- e. Anecdotal/personal testimony demonstrating the positive impact of the Program;
- f. Quantifiable evidence of progress toward the measurable objectives identified in the Digital Equity Plan;
- g. Impact on the State or Territory's goals regarding:
 - i. Economic and workforce development outcomes;
 - ii. Educational outcomes;
 - iii. Health outcomes;
 - iv. Civic and social engagement; and
 - v. Delivery of essential services.



Funding Information

Total amount of funding expected to be awarded through this NOFO is up to \$13,500,000. Awards will range from \$30,000 to \$300,000 on an annual basis, for a three-year term.

Use of Funds:

- To develop and implement digital inclusion activities that benefit covered populations.
- To facilitate the adoption of broadband by covered populations in order to provide educational and employment opportunities to those populations.
- To implement
 - o training programs for covered populations that cover basic, advanced, and applied skills; or
 - other workforce development programs.
- To make available equipment, instrumentation, networking capability, hardware and software, or digital network technology for broadband services to covered populations at low or no cost.
- To construct, upgrade, expend, or operate new or existing public access computing centers for covered populations through community anchor institutions.



Eligible Entities

A foundation, corporation, institution, or association that is a not-for-profit entity and not a school.

Entities that carry out workforce development programs

An Indian Tribe, an Alaska Native entity, or a Native Hawaiian organization

Community anchor institution, meaning a public school, housing authority, library, healthcare provider, higher education institutions and other nonprofit or community support organizations.

A local **educational agency**

Political subdivision, agency including those supervising adult education and literacy activities or for

providing public housing

A **partnership** between any of the entities described above.



Cost Sharing or Matching

Cost sharing or matching means the portion of project costs not paid by grant funds but rather contributed by the applicant through other funding sources and/or in-kind contributions.

- To ensure that IDEC is accessible and equitable, cost sharing or matching funds are not required for an application to be competitive but are encouraged.
- Matching funds are not a part of the scoring rubric.



Indirect Cost Rate

- All grantees must complete an indirect cost rate negotiation (NICRA) or elect the
 De Minimis Rate to claim indirect costs. Indirect costs claimed without a
 negotiated rate or a De Minimis Rate election on record in the State of Illinois'
 centralized indirect cost rate system may be subject to disallowance.
- The following State University Facilities & Administration Rate and Base will apply to all State issued awards that contain either Federal pass-through funding or State funding.

RATE:

- 20% Rate for awards or programs administered On-Campus*
- 10% Rate for awards or programs administered Off-Campus*



Conflict of Interest Disclosure

Conflict of Interest Disclosure

Award applicants and recipients of awards from the State of Illinois (collectively referred to herein as "Grantee") must disclose in writing to the awarding State agency any actual or potential conflict of interest that could affect the State award for which the Grantee has applied or has received. See 30 ILCS 708/35; 44 Ill. Admin. Code § 7000.40(b)(3); 2 CFR § 200.112. A conflict of interest exists if an organization's officers, directors, agents, employees and/or their spouses or immediate family members use their position(s) for a purpose that is, or gives the appearance of, being motivated by a desire for a personal gain, financial or nonfinancial, whether direct or indirect, for themselves or others, particularly those with whom they have a family business or other close associations. In addition, the following conflict of interest standards apply to governmental and non-governmental entities.

Definitions:

Governmental Entity. If the Grantee is a governmental entity, no officer or employee of the Grantee, member of its governing body or any other public official of the locality in which the award objectives will be carried out shall participate in any decision relating to a State award which affects his/her personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he/she is directly or indirectly interested, or which affects the personal interest of a spouse or immediate family member, or has any financial interest, direct or indirect, in the work to be performed under the State award.

Non-governmental Entity. If the Grantee is a non-governmental entity, no officer or employee of the Grantee shall participate in any decision relating to a State award which affects his/her personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he/she is directly or indirectly interested, or which affects the personal interest of a spouse or immediate family member, or has any financial interest, direct or indirect, in the work to be performed under the State award.

The Grantee shall also establish safeguards, evidenced by policies, rules and/or bylaws, to prohibit employees or officers of Grantee from engaging in actions, which create or which appear to create a conflict of interest as described herein.

Sample Budget Make-Up

Digital Literacy and Skill Building

Cost of digital skills curriculum or certification, space, barrier-reducing costs for participants, marketing and supplies.

Device Distribution

Equipment, personnel and fringe benefits, supplies, contractual services for tech support and skills training as needed

Digital Navigator(s)

Personnel and fringe benefits, travel, supplies

Computer Center

Occupancy (rent & utilities), equipment, personnel and fringe benefits, travel, supplies

Local Broadband Planning

Contractual Services with engineering and consulting firms, personnel and fringe benefits, travel

Consider language access, staff training, fair wages, and focus use of funding on direct community benefit.



Merit Review

- Merit Review Committee will evaluate and grade each application (3 reviewers per application)
- An average of all scores will be the final applicant score
- Grants will be awarded in order from highest score to lowest score until funding is exhausted, with a priority for geographic diversity and ensuring service across all Covered Populations.
- Applications will be reviewed against others in their economic development region. A scoring threshold will be established per economic development regions to determine funded applications.
- Applications that are not selected in Wave 1 will carry over to Wave 2 for evaluation.







Award Administration Information



Funding terms and conditions will be specified in NOSA (Notice of State Award)



Agreement(s) and budget(s) with subrecipients and subcontractors must be pre-approved by and on file with DCEO. The successful applicant shall retain sole responsibility for the performance of its subrecipient(s) and/or subcontractor(s).



Applicants are eligible for multi-year grants if the renewals are conditioned on a comprehensive evaluation of the awardee's fiscal, administrative, and programmatic compliance during the preceding grant term.





Reporting and Monitoring



Periodic (quarterly) Performance Report (PPR) and Periodic Financial Report (PFR)



Grantees are required within 45 calendar days following the end of the period of performance to submit a final closeout report



Grantees funded through this NOFO must completing electronic reports on a quarterly basis. Metrics from reports will be used to evaluate grantee progress, and contribute to a statewide evaluation of progress toward goals outlined in the State Digital Equity Plan.



Grantees funded through this NOFO are subject to fiscal and programmatic monitoring visits by the Department



Grantees shall be subject to Illinois' statewide Audit Report Review requirements.
