



8 STEP FLOODPLAIN REVIEW VILLAGE OF PITTSBURG - PI CDBG GRANT #19-242023

The following 8-Step Review was undertaken in order to comply with State and Federal regulations as a condition of the grant award to the Village of Pittsburg from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunities (DCEO) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

1. Is project in base floodplain?

Yes. A portion of the target area is located in a base floodplain.

2. Early Public Review

A notice of Early Public Review for construction was published in the Marion Daily on October 15, 2020 (see attached Certificate of Publication). A fifteen day comment period was allowed.

3. Identify and Evaluate Alternatives

Alternative 1: The Village of Pittsburg could maintain the status quo and simply maintain the line in the floodplain with the antiquated asbestos line.

Alternative 2: The Village of Pittsburg could completely remove the current lines and re-route them at a great cost to the Village and possibly leave homes without fire protection or water service.

Alternative 3: Replace failing asbestos cement water mains as is being proposed.

4. For each alternative, determine if project would indirectly or directly impact floodplain.

The project as proposed would not indirectly or directly impact the floodplain. The water mains to be replaced are already located in the floodplain area and will be replaced within the existing water system in existing Village right-of-way. No construction work to be done will impact the floodplain. No new buildings will be constructed as a result of this program.

 If the proposed project would directly or indirectly impact the base floodplain, effects must be minimized to protect natural and beneficial floodplain values.

This project will neither directly nor indirectly impact the base floodplain as the existing water mains will be replaced in the same locations.

Re-evaluate alternatives taking into account the identified impacts, steps necessary
to minimize these impacts and opportunities to restore and preserve floodplain
values.

The proposed project remains the most economically and environmentally viable option. This is due to the need to replace existing deteriorating water lines in order to minimize water loss and leaks.

7. If only alternative is to locate in the base floodplain, publish notice identifying reasons for this finding and the alternatives considered.

A Findings and Public Explanation for Construction in a Floodplain was published in the Marion Daily on November 19, 2020 (see attached Certificate of Publication). A seven day comment period was allowed.

8. Implement project.

Having received no objection, the Village of Pittsburg will proceed with the proposed project.

The Miami Tribe of Oklahoma, a federally recognized Indian tribe with a Constitution ratified in 1939 under the Oklahoma Indian Welfare Act of 1936, respectfully submits the following comments regarding Village of Pittsburg Water Main Replacement in Williamson County, Illinois.

The Miami Tribe offers no objection to the above-referenced project at this time, as we are not currently aware of existing documentation directly linking a specific Miami cultural or historic site to the project site. However, given the Miami Tribe's deep and enduring relationship to its historic lands and cultural property within present-day Illinois, if any human remains or Native American cultural items falling under the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) or archaeological evidence is discovered during any phase of this project, the Miami Tribe requests immediate consultation with the entity of jurisdiction for the location of discovery. 



FINAL NOTICE OF DECISION REGARDING PROJECT TO BE LOCATED IN A WETLAND

February 25, 2021

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS, AND PERSONS:

As required by Executive Order 11990, this is a notice of findings and public explanation for proposed activity in a wetland.

The Village of Pittsburg proposes to use funds allocated through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program for the following proposed project: Water District Public Infrastructure Improvements. The proposed project would include the replacement of approximately 22,000 linear feet of 8" asbestos cement water main along and near Old Frankfort Road, from Stein Lane north to Mustang Road south and east on Fowler School Road, pressure tapped water main interconnections, gate valves, flush hydrants, 88 new coppersetters and other miscellaneous appurtenances.

The Village of Pittsburg hereby states that this proposed project would occur within a portion of an identified wetland. However, the Village of Pittsburg has reached a decision that this is the only practicable alternative for this proposed project. This decision is based on an evaluation of the following alternatives: Alternative 1: The Village of Pittsburg could maintain the status quo and retain the line in the wetland as is with antiquated asbestos lines leaving the opportunity for continuous water leaks and loss. Alternative 2: The Village of Pittsburg could completely remove the current lines and re-route them at a great cost to the Village and possibly leave homes without water service or fire protection. Alternative 3: The Village of Pittsburg could replace the failing asbestos cement water mains as is being proposed. The Village of Pittsburg would, however, ensure that this proposed project conforms to all state and local wetlands protection standards and would implement the following mitigation measures to minimize the potential adverse impacts: replace the water lines within the existing water system in existing Village right of ways, all wetland crossings will be directional bored with no surface impact.






