The Business Enterprise Program (BEP) which is administered by the State of Illinois Commission on Equity & Inclusion, assists businesses owned by minorities, women and people with disabilities gain access to the State of Illinois procurement process. The BEP certification with the State of Illinois can also open the door to opportunities with other public and private entities which are looking for diverse suppliers. The FastTrack certification process allows reciprocity with City of Chicago and Cook County to provide a pathway to BEP certification in 7 days or less. The BEP also has a Mentor Protégé Program to foster the development and mentoring of minority, women, and persons with disabilities-owned businesses and enables experienced firms to provide various types of support to create more equitable access for economic growth while meeting the State's BEP contracting goals.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) | <u>link</u>

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program which is administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), provides minorities, women, and other eligible small businesses an opportunity to participate in transportation contracts that utilize federal funds.


