ILLINOIS' SUPPORT FOR WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES (WOBs)

DCEO Recovery Grant Programs

Since 2020, Governor JB Pritzker & Lt. Governor Julianna Stratton's Administration, the General Assembly, and DCEO has provided more than **\$190 million** in awards through Business Interruption and Back to Business Grants to IL WOBs.

Illinois Angel Investment Tax Credit Program²

Investments in IL WOBs since 2019: over **\$20 million**

The Advantage Illinois – State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) 2.0 Program

Between 2023 and September 2024:

- 90 approved Socially & Economically Disadvantaged Individuals (SEDI) gender projects
- Close to \$50 million in total approved SEDI 'gender' projects
- Close to \$38 million in total approved SEDI 'gender' loans
- Over \$18 million in total DCEO funding to approved SEDI 'gender' loans

Business Advising through the IL Small Business Development Centers (IL SBDCs)

- Over 4,800 women throughout Illinois received at no cost business advising in 2023 from the IL SBDCs.
- Over 2,400 women throughout Illinois were trained at no cost in 2023 through the IL SBDCs.
- Amount of financial capital infusion obtained by IL WOBs and attributed to the services received by the IL SBDCs in 2023; close to \$18 million
- Amount of export sales reported by IL WOBs and attributed to the services received in 2023 by the IL SBDCs: over \$19 million

Business Invest - Community Uplift Program⁵

Through the Office of Illinois State Treasurer Michael W. Frerichs, the Business Invest - Community Uplift Program (CUP) has supported Illinois women-owned businesses such as coffee shops, construction companies, rental real estate companies, etc., through:

- Over \$4.6 million deposited to Illinois women-owned/operated businesses since 2019
- For 2023 alone over \$2.6 million was distributed to Illinois women-owned/operated businesses.

Government Contracts Advising through the Illinois APEX Accelerator

- In 2023, over 1,000 WOBs were served by the IL APEX Accelerator.
- The amount in government contracts secured by IL WOBs thanks to the help of the IL APEX Accelerator in 2023 = over \$352 million

Business Enterprise Program Certification7

In 2023, **3,000** Illinois WOBs became certified firms through the Illinois Commision on Equity & Inclusion's Business Enterprise Program:

- over 1,560 WOBs received FPE certification
- over 1,460 WOBs received FME certification
