Exports are a Vital Part of Illinois' Economy^A

- Preliminary Illinois exports totaled over \$78.67 billion in 2022. The preliminary agricultural adjusted figure for 2022 is \$82.69 billion; both All Time Highs.^c
- Since 2009, Illinois exports have increased by \$37.05 billion, or 89.0%
- Illinois is the largest exporting state in the Midwest and the 5th largest in the nation, using agricultural adjusted figures provided by Census Bureau/USDA cash receipts.^c
- 19 out of top 20 export industries increased since 2021
- 19 out of top 20 export industries increased since 2009
- Top 10 Illinois export industries have seen gains since 2009
- 9 of the top 10 Illinois export partner countries have seen gains since 2009
- Export activities support over 800K jobs in Illinois.^B

Total Trade between Illinois and Chile in 2022

- Illinois exports to Chile totaled \$907.4 million in 2022, a 69.6% increase since 2009. Chile is Illinois' 16th largest export market
- Illinois ranks 5th among the 50 U.S. states in exports to Chile
- Illinois imports from Chile totaled \$230.3 million in 2022, a 209.4% increase since 2009. Chile is Illinois' 41st largest import market
- Ilinois ranks 12th among the 50 U.S. states in imports from Chile
